

This painting (circa 1872) by John Gast called American Progress, is an allegorical representation of the modernization of the new west.

Here <u>Columbia</u>, intended as a personification of the <u>United States</u>, leads civilization westward with American settlers, stringing telegraph wire as she travels; she holds a school book.

The different economic activities of the pioneers are highlighted and, especially, the changing forms of transportation.

The Native Americans and wild animals flee.
